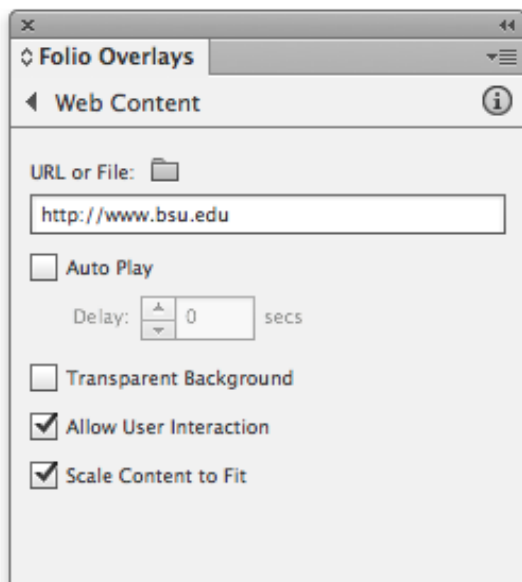


### CREATING A WEB CONTENT FRAME

This tutorial walks you through creating a frame that contains **Web Content**. Web content can be embedded into your document in one of two ways. You can specify a web URL or a local HTML file.

#### Step One

Go to Window > Folio Overlays to open the folio overlays panel.



#### Step Two

Draw a box on your page using the Rectangle Frame Tool; it can be any width and height. Select the box and then select the Web Content menu from the Folio Overlays panel. Click the input box under URL or File and enter: `http://www.bsu.edu`. Also select Scale Content to Fit.

#### Step Three

Click the preview button to test your web content. Select Preview on Desktop.

#### Step Four

Now, let's try loading local HTML files. For this tutorial, a folder called WebContent has been created along with two html files.

#### Step Five

Make a new box on your page using the Rectangle Frame Tool; it can be any width and height. Select the box and then select the Web Content menu from the Folio Overlays panel. Click the small folder next to Load Images. Find the WebContent folder, select `cnn.html` and click Open. This will automatically load the html files into the frame. Also select Scale Content to Fit.

#### Step Six

Click the preview button to test your web content. Select Preview on Desktop.
